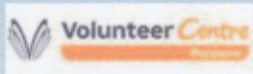
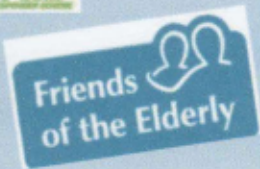
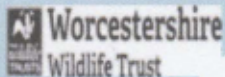

SUPPORT – 1st April 2020 to 26th January 2021

(10 Months)

The MCF prepares Impact Statements up to 31st March each year.

Clearly the last statement does not cover the pandemic period.

However, between 1st April 2020 and 26th January 2021 (ten months), the MCF made grants providing support for Worcestershire Freemasons and their families totalling **£137,000**, and to local charities **£86,500**. An overall sum of **£223,500**.

These figures when annualised, amount to

Our Festival efforts go to London never to be seen again
... NO! – Averaging the above figures and applying them to our 11-year Festival cycle, Worcestershire is a net beneficiary. Over 11 years, approximately **£2,689,025** would come back to the Province. Don't forget that in our 2011 Festival we raised **£1,680,000** and hopefully by Spring of 2023 nearer to our **£2,022,000**
